Bob 'Bobby' Randall

Bob Randall's love of cars and competition was one of the main factors to the success of this man. Like many racers, he began tinkering with cars at a young age and grew that passion into a dream and a twenty-one year racing career.

With the support of family and friends, Bob began racing in 1974 in the Limited Sportsman division at Beech Ridge Motor Speedway. He soon established himself as a respected driver. Two years later, he moved up to the Late Model class and seeing his number 91 Chevrolet Nova in the winner's circle became a familiar sight for many fans.

In his twenty-one year racing career, Randall won four Late Model track championships (1979-1981, 1988), over sixty victories and he raced on sixteen different tracks from Maine to Dover, Delaware to Quebec Canada.

Two of his favorite race wins took place when the ACT Late Model Tour visited Beech Ridge. In 1990, Bob broke the five-year long ACT dominance over the local drivers and teams when he won a 150-lap ACT race. To prove the win was "no fluke", Bob out ran the ACT contingent again the following year.

Several of Bob's other notable accomplishments include: recipient of the first Driver-of-the-Year and recipient of the Memorial Blazer, both in 1991; several Most Popular Driver awards and, at the conclusion of his final year as a driver (1995), induction into the Beech Ridge Hall of Fame.
