Harold 'Bub' Bilodeau

Over thirty-four years, beginning in 1977, Bub Bilodeau left a legendary stamp on the history of motorsports in the State of Maine. At Beech Ridge Motor Speedway alone, Bub was a three-time track champon, the one and only three-time recipient of Driver-of-the-Year honors (1996, 2004, 2007), the 2010 Lifetime Achievement Award recipient, and one of fifty-four to be inducted into the Beech Ridge Hall of Fame.

Bub recorded his first top-ten finish in the season's standings at Beech Ridge in 1980, and over his next nine seasons, he would only finish outside of the top-five once, which was a seventh-place finish in 1985. He would race weekly on-and-off for the next several years, spending more time in various touring series and at Oxford Plains Speedway, where he won the speed-



way's Triple Crown Series championship (1998) and recorded ten wins over seven seasons.

When he returned to full-time Beech Ridge competition in 2003, the results that followed would be nothing short of phenomenal. He would become a Pro Series champion in 2004, 2007 and 2008.

Bilodeau amassed eighteen full-season attempts at Beech Ridge in the Late Model Sportsman, Late Model, and Pro Series divisions and only finished outside of the top-ten in the standings three times. If he were to have a batting average for finishing in the top-five in the standings, it would be 0.667, with more than half of his total attempts resulting in a top-three finish

In June 2010, Bub passed away shortly after a feature event at Beech Ridge. In the following Pro Scrips 100-lap event, the Beech Ridge faithful stood to their feet to salute their fallen hero on lap 9, the same No. 9 they had witnessed Bub drive into Victory Lane for decades.
