Kenny Wright

Kenny Wright first climbed behind the wheel of a race car in 1981 when he was seventeen years old. He competed in the Street Stock division, or beginner's class, at Wiscasset Speedway. Apparently, Kenny was a "natural" as he not only won races as a rookie but he won

the division championship.

Over the next twenty-plus years, Kenny would compete at race tracks all over New England and eastern Canada. He won many more races, especially long distance races, and a number of track and touring series championships.

Despite his championship winning rookie season, it would take Kenny eight years to win his second title – a Late Model Sportsman championship at Unity Raceway in 1989. He doubled up that championship



the following year to win back-to-back crowns at Unity. Three years later, Kenny would win his first of back-to-back Pro Stock division track championships at Wiscasset Speedway.

With the creation of the New England Pro Stock Association (NEPSA) in 1996, Kenny became a regular competitor on the touring series. He finished in the top ten in points the first four years of NEPSA and winning the series championship in 1998.

Kenny Wright has had a very successful career driving a race car — competing on nearly twenty different race tracks in New England and eastern Canada, winning an estimated seventy-five races and capturing six track and touring series championships.
