Harvey Sprague began his racing career in the late 60's at the age of 18 at Speedway 95 and Unity Raceway. While he didn't find instant success, he was a quick study and took pointers from top competitors like Dana Graves and soon found his way to victory lane. It all came together in 1970 as Harvey wheeled his 56' Ford to the Speedway 95 championship. Through the 70's he wheeled his fast #97 Fords to feature wins at Bangor, Unity, Ellsworth, Wiscasset, and many other tracks around the northeast. In the late 70's he teamed up with car owner Louis Stewart and ran in the Oxford Open Series. The pair took home runner-up honors in the 1979 Oxford 250. Overall, during his racing career that lasted 20 years, Harvey Sprague raced and flourished against many of the sports best, gathering over 80 feature wins, many of them extra distance events, including the 1984 Coca Cola 100 at Wiscasset. He was a versatile and competitive driver that found success no matter where he raced. Harvey Sprague joins the select company as a Maine Motorsports Hall of Famer.
